SUBJECT: Calendar Year 2021 Schedule of 1502 Report & Payment Due Dates for 7(a) Loans

EFFECTIVE: December 4, 2020

The purpose of this notice is to inform SBA employees, Lenders and Community Advantage Lenders about the SBA Form 1502 report and payment due dates for calendar year 2021. According to the SBA Form 1086, payments are due at the Fiscal and Transfer Agent (FTA) on the third **calendar** day of the month, or the next business day if the third is not a business day. The SBA allows a grace period of two business days after the due date.

If the FTA receives a regularly scheduled payment after the expiration of the grace period, a Late Payment Penalty is assessed. The SBA Form 1086 describes the components of the Late Payment Penalty. Lenders are billed for Late Penalties at the end of each month. Late Penalties are due to the FTA, Colson Services Corporation or its successor, with the Lender's next monthly Form 1502 remittance.

Below is a schedule of **FINAL** due dates, which includes the grace period of two business days for regularly scheduled payments.
